Gene reported that the Association still has funds on hand, but the number of financial supporters is reduced. Hank Towers suggested that a plea for "dues" be included in the next newsletter. Many attendees made a contribution at the end of the meeting. The suggested amount is \$15.00 per boat owner.

There followed a report and discussion of the Owner's Manual. There has been slower than expected progress since last year, but Gerald Clapp has made a rough version that seems to be acceptable to all present. More work is needed. There was a separate meeting afterwards in which matters of printing and copying were discussed by Messrs. Reardon, Clapp, Eichner and Converse. Gene Reardon expressed concern about including copyrighted magazine articles in the book. Stu Eichner volunteered to write for permission to Yachting and This Old Boat.

The annual question about the location for next year's meeting was discussed. Although it was agreed that we do not necessarily have to be connected to a boat show, there did not seem to be any meaningful suggestion of a different location.
