Dear Fellow Seabreeze Owner:

The roster revision list that is enclosed shows one additional boat. Harold Puckett's *KIAMBO* (hull #30) is our 113th listing. That accounts for 84% of all the Seabreezes ever built. If you come across one that we don't list, please make every effort to nail down as much of the roster information on it as possible. Don't assume the opportunity will come again. I'll be glad to do the follow up with letters and phone calls, but I need a place to start. As a minimum, try to get the owner's name and address, the boat name, color and rig and berth location and, if possible, the hull and sail numbers.

As an aid in beating the brush, I've assembled scraps of mostly-obsolete information to make a list of hull numbers of boats of which we've never heard. Quite possibly, they are on the West Coast, in other countries, or have gone to that great boatyard in the sky. The list is on the following page.

I'm also enclosing a list of the boats currently on the market. There seems to be a few more listed than usual. Some owners are getting old, some are moving down to larger boats and, I suppose, some are just getting bored. It can't hurt the value of our collectors' items to try to maintain a market, and we probably all get occasional inquiries about the availability of "a boat like that".

The roster revisions include repowering for Alan Harrop's *SWALLOW* (#128). He would also like it known that he has a workable 4-107 available for parts. Don't ask about the transmission.

Summer long-range planning seems to have been a little longer range than usual this year. That being the case, the following rendezvous dates are hereby promulgated.

Thursday, July 15: Rendezvous at Shelter Island Yacht Club, Dering Harbor, New York (Lat 41° 05.37' N, Long 72° 21.12' W). I will be host, and the Club launches and I monitor Ch. 9. Guest moorings will be available, and there is also room to anchor outside of the mooring grid. Weather permitting, you are invited to raft with *MANATUCK* during the day. Dinner is tentatively scheduled for six o'clock at the club, preceded by happy hour on the raft.

Tuesday, August 10: Rendezvous at Frenchboro, Long Island, Maine (Lat 44° 07.37' N, Long 68° 21.83' W). Hank Towers will be the host, and will be monitoring Ch. 9. Happy hour will be aboard *FINBARR*, with cooked lobsters available ashore.

These are both great cruising destinations and afford excellent opportunities for socializing and boat-looking. Come on out and join the fun.
